





Instructions for Authors

Manuscript Submission

By submitting a manuscript, you confirm that the described work has not been previously published, is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, and has been approved by all coauthors and responsible authorities at the institute where the work was conducted. The publisher assumes no legal responsibility for any claims for compensation.

Permissions

Authors must obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) for any previously published figures, tables, or text passages they wish to include in their papers, whether in print or online format. It is essential to include evidence of this permission when submitting the papers. If no evidence of permission is provided, it will be assumed that the material originates from the authors themselves.

Source Files

Please make sure to include all relevant editable source files in each submission and revision. Failure to provide a complete set of editable source files will result in your article not being considered for review. Please submit your manuscript text in commonly used word processing formats such as .docx.

Author information

Please provide the following information for each author:

- The name(s) of the author(s).
- The affiliation(s) of the author(s), including the institution, department, city, state, and country.
- A clear indication and an active email address of the corresponding author.
- 16-digit ORCID of the author(s), if available.

Online Manuscript Submission

To submit your manuscript, please click on the "Submit manuscript" hyperlink and carefully follow the provided instructions to upload all of your manuscript files. For new users, please register and submit the manuscript in accordance with the submission guide. The submission process consists of two phases

- First, register and create an account using your email and the required information.
- Please include your title and abstract.
- If your abstract is approved, you can then proceed to submit your complete paper.
- When submitting your abstract and paper, it is important to follow the conference guidelines, including the blind review process, which requires authors to submit their names separately from the paper to ensure a fair and unbiased review.







To submit your paper and abstract, please follow the steps below:

- 1. **Review the conference guidelines:** Before submitting your abstract/paper, ensure that you have read and understood the conference guidelines to meet all the requirements.
- 2. Prepare your paper: Please ensure that your paper follows the conference guidelines. It should be well-written, clear, concise, properly formatted, and include all necessary sections such as an abstract, introduction, methodology, results, and conclusion. The manuscript should be prepared as a single file, including text, figures, and tables, and should confirm that all required sections are included.
- 3. **Submit your abstract/paper:** Go to the conference website and follow the submission instructions (refer to Online Manuscript Submission). Provide your contact information, paper title, and abstract, and upload your paper in the required format.
- 4. **Wait for the review process:** After submission, your abstract will undergo review by the conference committee. The review process may take several weeks, and you will be notified of the outcome via email. If accepted, you will be able to submit the full paper.
- 5. **Revise your paper:** If your paper is accepted, you may be asked to revise it based on reviewer feedback. Address all comments and suggestions provided.
- 6. **Prepare for presentation:** If your paper is accepted, you will be invited to present it at the conference. Prepare a clear and engaging presentation highlighting the key points of your paper. For the presentation format, please carefully read the guidelines for the presentation.

Cover Letter

A cover letter must be prepared when submitting articles to assist the author conveying the work's importance to the editors. You can either put it in the submission system or attach it as a separate file. Generally, a cover letter should contain the following parts:

- the title of the article
- the name and contact information of the corresponding author
- the names and affiliations of other authors
- a brief introduction of the paper, including its research significance

Use of Languages

Papers submitted to the conference must be written in English. If English is not your first language, please ensure the conference audience can easily understand your paper. You may use assistance tools or seek help from a native English writer to review your manuscript.
